GUIDELINES FOR LECTORS

REMINDER: If you are unable to serve when you are scheduled, **please make an effort to find a substitute** and call Liz Ferreira at (510) 828-2205 as soon as possible. Also let the other Reader you are scheduled with know. It is your responsibility to find a replacement.

DRESS CODE:

Please be sure to adhere to the Liturgical Ministers' Dress Guidelines for appropriate dress attire. A clean, neat, well-groomed appearance fosters a sense of reverence. Jeans, T-shirts, tennis shoes are considered inappropriate dress. Please call the office if you need a copy of this memo.

PROCEDURES:

Please try to arrive at church at least 10-15 minutes before mass.

The 1st Reader shall get the books out and ready. The 2nd Reader puts them away after mass.

The 1st Reader leads the procession, holding the book. If it is too heavy to hold up high, it is fine to hold lower, in front of your chest or have the 2nd Reader carry it. Once at the altar, the 1st Reader stops just to the left of the center of the altar. Once everyone is there, all bow, then the 1st Reader proceeds up to the altar, going to the left, and around the ambo.

Remember to bow when going to and coming from the ambo when it is time to read.

About halfway through the Creed, the reader doing the Petitions can proceed back up, remembering to bow before the altar.

Liturgical Ministers Dress Guidelines

Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Choir Members, Ushers, Greeters

“God does not require us to dress up; rather we dress up for God.” It is true that God is more interested in the attitude of our hearts, rather how we look when we come to church. However, the way we dress manifests an importance of the action in which we are engaging. Many of us are required to dress up for work and school. We automatically think of dressing up for weddings, proms, and other special occasions. Is not our worship of God more important?

It is true that we can “overdress” as well. Dressing up does not mean trying to impress others. Attention is to be brought to the Lord, not to us individuals.

General Principle: The Sunday Eucharist is the most significant activity of our worshipping community. With this idea in mind, we take care to prepare ourselves spiritually and externally for the most important moment of our week. Our external appearance speaks to the value we place on liturgy. We come consciously prepared to worship, minister to the assembly, gathered in sacred place.

Dress Guidelines: Appropriate dress for liturgy does not call attention to itself (oneself). A clean, neat, well-groomed appearance fosters a sense of reverence. By not calling attention to ourselves we enable the assembly to focus on its chief priority, worship of God and celebrating with the community. These guidelines apply to all liturgical ministers. All Liturgical ministers are asked to come appropriately dressed to fill in if a substitute is needed.

Men: A collared or knit shirt, appropriate pants, and clean shoes.

Women: Dresses, shirts, or dress slacks, with blouses or sweaters. For safety concern, simple shoes should be worn at all times.

Inappropriate Dress: Jeans, sweat or warm-up pants, shorts, leggings, caps, sport jerseys, sweatshirt. T-shirts, beach apparel, and extremely tight-fitting clothing. Dresses or skirts should be no shorter than 2 inches above the knees. Shoulder and midriffs are to be covered.
